END OF LIFE SURVEY 2023: RESULTS FROM THE ISLE OF MAN

About the survey


We undertook a survey in the Isle of Man, Jersey and Guernsey about the end of life on behalf of Dignity in Dying. The information shared here focuses on survey responses received from Isle of Man residents.

The online survey was launched in the Isle of Man on 18 September 2023 and data collection continued until 30 September 2023. IGR Research Panel members were sent an email inviting them to share their views. Links to the survey were also posted on social media (Facebook and Instagram) and included as a news item on the IGR website.

Isle of Man residents aged 16 and over were eligible to take part. The final dataset (after cleaning to remove incomplete and duplicate/suspicious responses) contained 1206 responses from Isle of Man residents.

Note: There is some indication of self-selection bias. This is inferred from the distribution of responses over the data collection period to the question "Do you support or oppose a change in the law to allow mentally competent, terminally ill adult residents the option of seeking assistance in their death?" (see next page for more detail).


When it comes to changing the law to legalise assisted dying in the Isle of Man, which of the following statements do you agree with most?*







Do you think it is important that changing the law to allow assisted dying in the Isle of Man is debated in this political term? 65% of respondents think it should be







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

Based on your opinion of the quality of palliative care in the Isle of Man, how confident do you feel that when you reach the end of your life you will be able to have the death that is "right" for you?






Regardless of whether or not you would want to have an assisted death in Switzerland yourself, to what extent do you think you would be able to afford this cost?*




