About the survey


We undertook a survey in the Jersey, Guernsey and the Isle of Man about the end of life on behalf of Dignity in Dying. The information shared here focuses on survey responses received from Jersey residents.


The online survey was launched in Jersey on 18 September 2023 and data collection continued until 30 September 2023. IGR Research Panel members were sent an email inviting them to share their views. Links to the survey were also posted on social media (Facebook and Instagram) and included as a news item on the IGR website.


Jersey residents aged 16 and over were eligible to take part. The final dataset (after cleaning to remove incomplete and duplicate/suspicious responses) contained 1183 responses from Jersey residents.

Note: There is some indication of self-selection bias. This is inferred from the distribution of responses over the data collection period to the question "Do you support or oppose a change in the law to allow mentally competent, terminally ill adult residents the option of seeking assistance in their death?" (see next page for more detail).



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

Based on your opinion of the quality of palliative care in the Jersey, how confident do you feel that when you reach the end of your life you will be able to have the death that is "right" for you?



Regardless of whether or not you would want to have an assisted death in Switzerland yourself, to what extent do you think you would be able to afford this cost?*






