BREXIT SURVEY

THE VIEWS OF JERSEY, GUERNSEY AND THE ISLE OF MAN





INTRODUCTION AND APPROACH

Brexit is rarely out of the headlines these days, and views are wide ranging. We conducted the survey to find out what people in Jersey, Guernsey and the Isle of Man think about Brexit and learn what they are worried about.

The survey was conducted online, and comprised of seven questions. Responses were collected between 27 September and 9 October 2019. We contacted our market research panel, inviting them to participate in the survey. We also promoted the survey using social media.

The survey was completed by 5,842 residents across the Crown Dependencies, with 2,127 respondents from Jersey, 1,610 from the Bailiwick of Guernsey and 2,105 from the Isle of Man.

The sample of respondents closely resembled the age and gender profile of adults resident in each island. Survey weights were applied to adjust for the small differences between the age and gender of the sample and the resident population. This is a standard statistical method that allows us to report results for the island as a whole.






How closely are you following news about Brexit?

What impact do you think Brexit will have on your island if the UK leaves the EU...













Do you think your government is doing enough to prepare for Brexit?

61% of people in Jersey would prefer Britain to remain in the EU, while 39% would prefer Britain to leave.

Only 21% of people think the Government of Jersey is doing enough to prepare for Brexit.

60% of people in Guernsey would prefer Britain to remain in the EU, while 40% would prefer Britain to leave.

Only 25% of people think the States of Guernsey is doing enough to prepare for Brexit.

49% of people in the Isle of Man would prefer Britain to remain in the EU, while 51% would prefer Britain to leave.

Only 22% of people think the Manx Government is doing enough to prepare for Brexit.

Leaving the EU without a deal:


- 22% of residents would prefer to leave without a deal.
- 54% think Brexit will have a negative or very negative impact on Jersey if Britain were to leave the EU without a deal.
- 71% are worried about the price of food increasing in the event of Britain leaving the EU without a deal.
 Delays to imports and exports from the EU, delays in travelling to and from the EU and medicine shortage are also events that over half of people are worried about.
- When asked which of the events they were MOST worried about (up to 3), increased food prices followed by medicine shortages were of greatest concern.
- Leave supporters are less likely than remain supporters to be worried about the potential impacts of Britain leaving with the EU without a deal.
- When compared with a recent UK survey*, people living in Jersey are similarly worried as people in the UK about medicine and food shortages. But they are more worried than those living in the UK about increased food prices, delays to imports/exports from the EU, citizens losing benefits in the EU and delays travelling to/from the EU.

- 22% of residents would prefer to leave without a deal.
- 50% think Brexit will have a negative or very negative impact on Guernsey if Britain were to leave the EU without a deal.
- 67% are worried about the price of food increasing in the event of Britain leaving the EU without a deal.
 Delays to imports and exports from the EU, delays in travelling to and from the EU and medicine shortage are also events that over half of people are worried about.
- When asked which of the events they were MOST worried about (up to 3), medicine shortages followed by increased food prices were of greatest concern.
- Leave supporters are less likely than remain supporters to be worried about the potential impacts of Britain leaving with the EU without a deal.
- When compared with a recent UK survey*, people in living in Guernsey are similarly worried as people in the UK about medicine shortages, increased food prices and food shortages. But they are more worried than those living in the UK about delays to imports/exports from the EU, citizens losing benefits in the EU and delays travelling to/from the EU.

Leaving the EU without a deal:

- 33% of residents would prefer to leave without a deal.
- 45% think Brexit will have a negative or very negative impact on the Isle of Man if Britain were to leave the EU without a deal.
- 55% are worried about the price of food increasing in the event of Britain leaving the EU without a deal.
 Delays to imports and exports from the EU, delays in travelling to and from the EU and medicine shortage are also events that over half of people are worried about.
- When asked which of the events they were MOST worried about (up to 3), medicine shortages were of greatest concern.
- Leave supporters are less likely than remain supporters to be worried about the potential impacts of Britain leaving with the EU without a deal.
- When compared with a recent UK survey*, people
 living in the Isle of Man are similarly worried as people
 resident in the UK about medicine shortages and
 increased food prices. They are more worried than
 those living in the UK about delays to imports/exports
 from the EU, citizens losing benefits in the EU, delays
 travelling to/from the EU and the breakdown of the
 Irish peace process.
